RDA Europe 4.0


- need for the open and interoperable sharing of research data, and the need to build social and technical and cross-disciplinary links to enable this sharing on a global scale
- community-driven and bottom-up approach launched in 2012.
- how the EU can contribute to implementing an effective governance model and strategy within RDA global that ensures RDA delivers on locally relevant issues
- > new, open and dynamic structure to expand the RDA community in Europe. It builds on existing networks to create a European network of nodes to enhance member state cooperation and support of RDA in many European countries by 2020, enhancing EU competitiveness and EU leadership within RDA Global.



9 specific objectives:

- 1. Becoming the Centrepiece for an EU Open Science Strategy through consolidated EU nodes;
- 2. Providing the skilled, voluntary resources from the EU investment to address Digital Single Market (DSM) issues;
- 3. Facilitating cross-disciplinary & multi-disciplinary research;
- 4. Building, strengthening, and consolidating an RDA global community;
- 5. Contributing to global interoperable data infrastructure;
- **6. Democratising access to funding opportunities** in data infrastructures & interoperability;
- 7. Driving the process of **RDA ICT Technical Specifications** in Europe;
- 8. Developing a **sustainable path for the RDA in Europe**;
- 9. Bringing forward the **RDA legacy in Europe**.

A 27 month project (start 1 March 2018) with a clear set of strategic objectives & specific outputs building on the previous phases, the RDA legacy & its community-driven and bottom-up approach launched in 2012.

Nodes & Activities going forward


Nodes should act as the **central contact point between the national / regional data practitioners and RDA**, through the following activities:

- > Creation, organisation and management of a national / regional RDA community;
- Participation in and representation on the RDA Europe Governing Board (as defined in section 3.2);
- > Interaction with national research funding bodies and RDA governance;
- **Promotion of open calls** for European participation in RDA (plenary meetings, support programmes, ambassadors, early career programmes, etc.);
- Identification of strategic themes and domains as focus of European cascading grants / open calls;
- Organisation of events (meetings, workshops, training courses etc.) to disseminate & promote RDA activities and outputs;
- Dissemination of RDA activities and output and encouraging participation in RDA activities and adoption of outputs, leveraging on the knowledge of the local research system.

A network of national and regional "nodes" is an essential and fundamental component of the growth, consolidation and sustainability of RDA in Europe (RDA EU3 Informal Review).
